Background

- Objective: To identify telecenters in operation around the Caribbean and capture information on their main characteristics, issues and challenges
- Survey undertaken by way of questionnaires

Countries

- CARICOM states, Dominican Republic, Cuba, Cayman, Puerto Rico, Dutch and French dependencies.

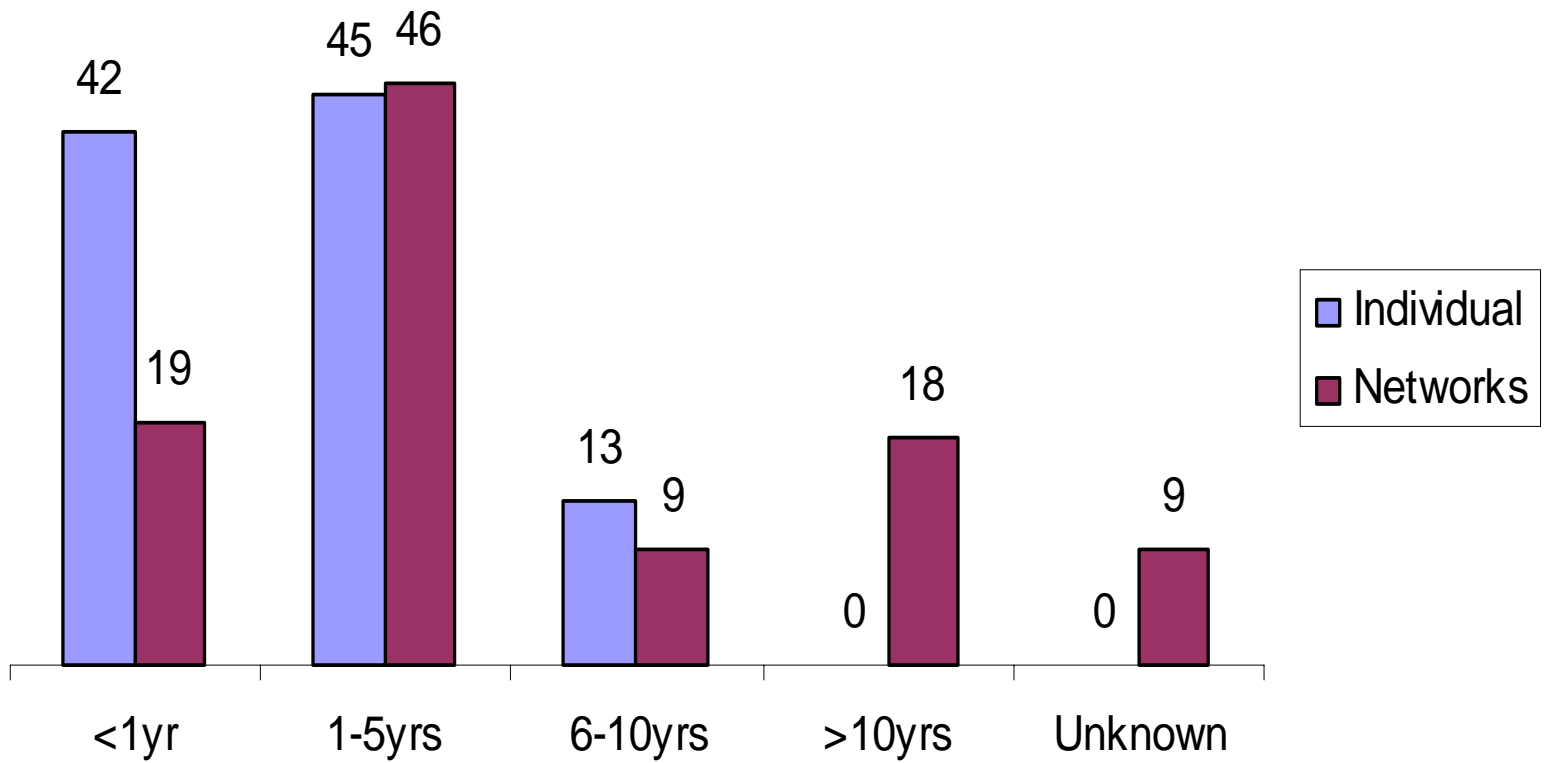
Methodology

- Questionnaires sent to over 100 individual telecenter locations and networks
- 56 attempted responses - 44 successful responses (i.e. more than 60% filled in)

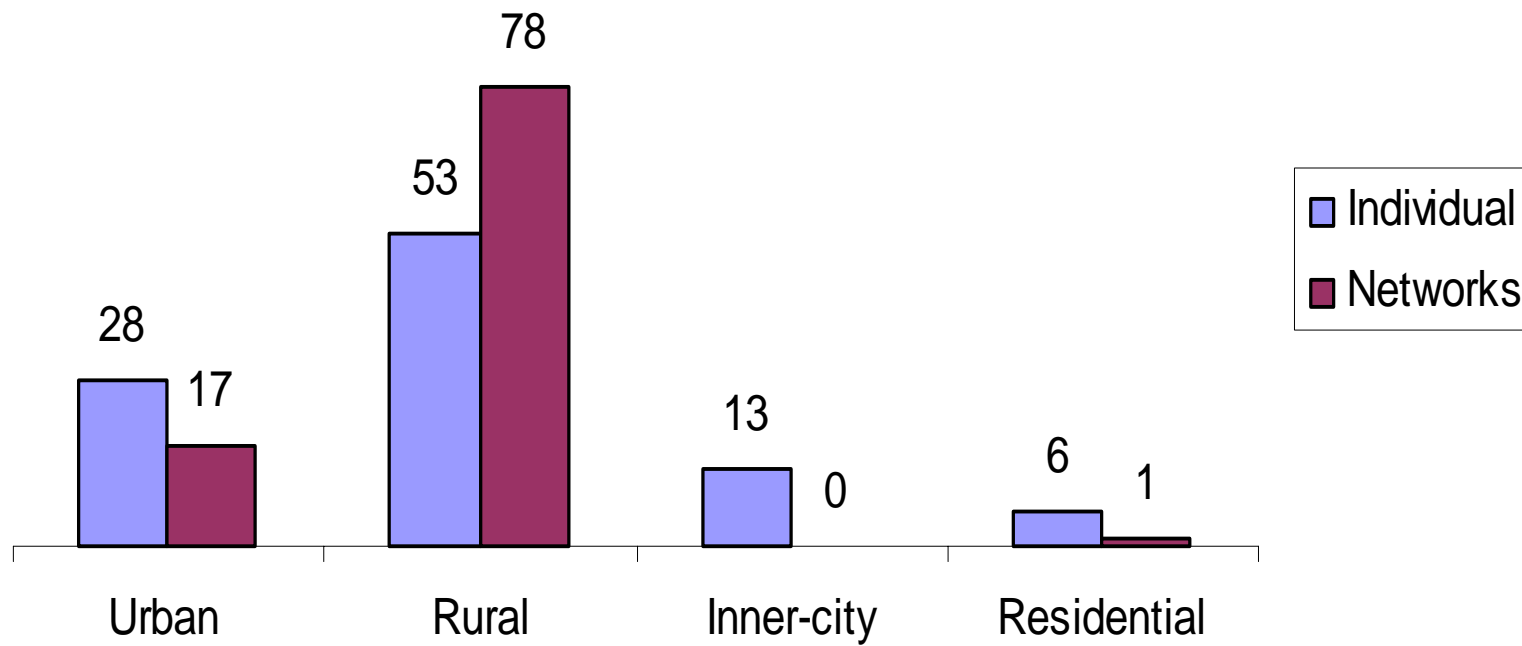
Results

- Reports received on 965 telecenters
- 35 represent individual telecenters
- 930 are part of 11 national networks e.g. Cuba (600); Puerto Rico (Apsira- 150 and CTCs – 65) and Martinique (37)

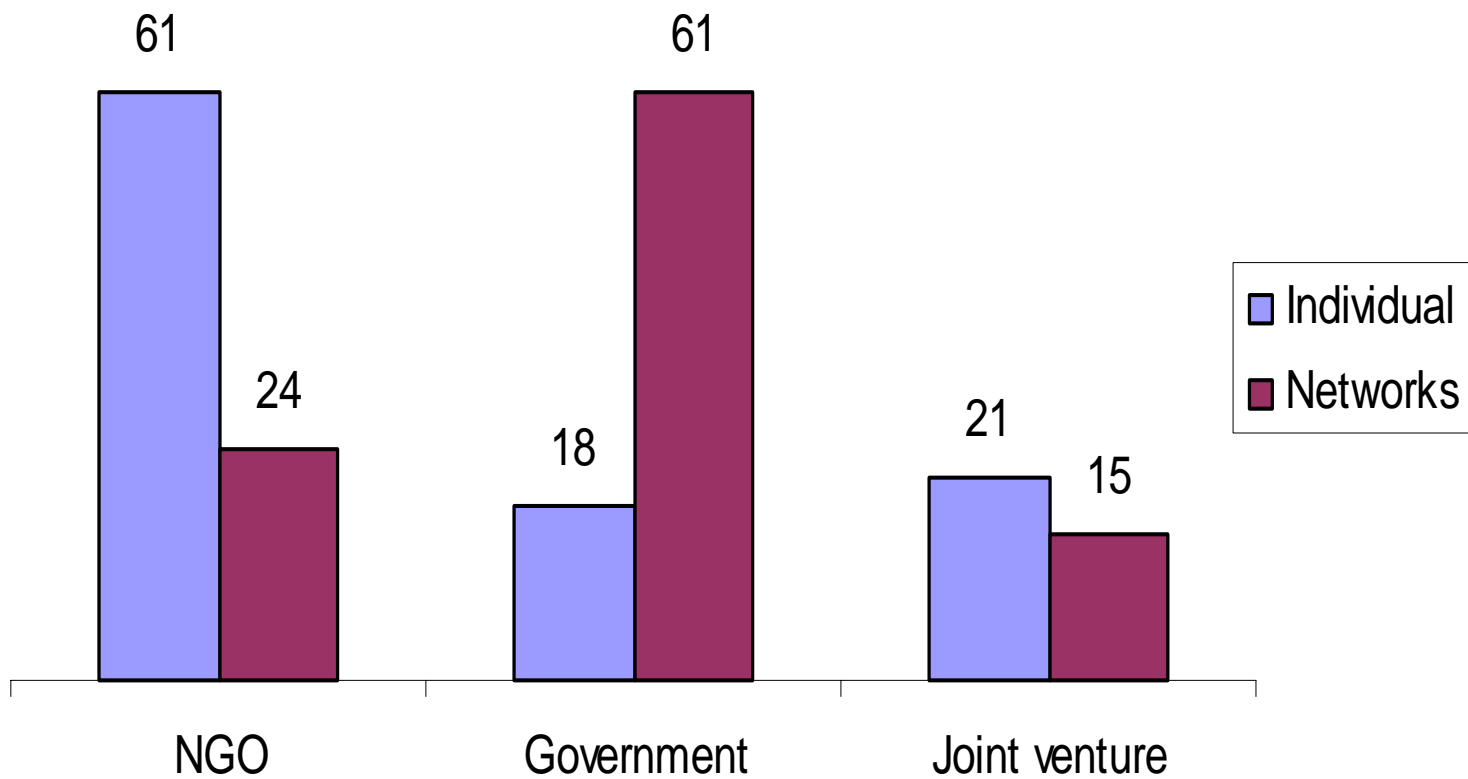
Time in operation



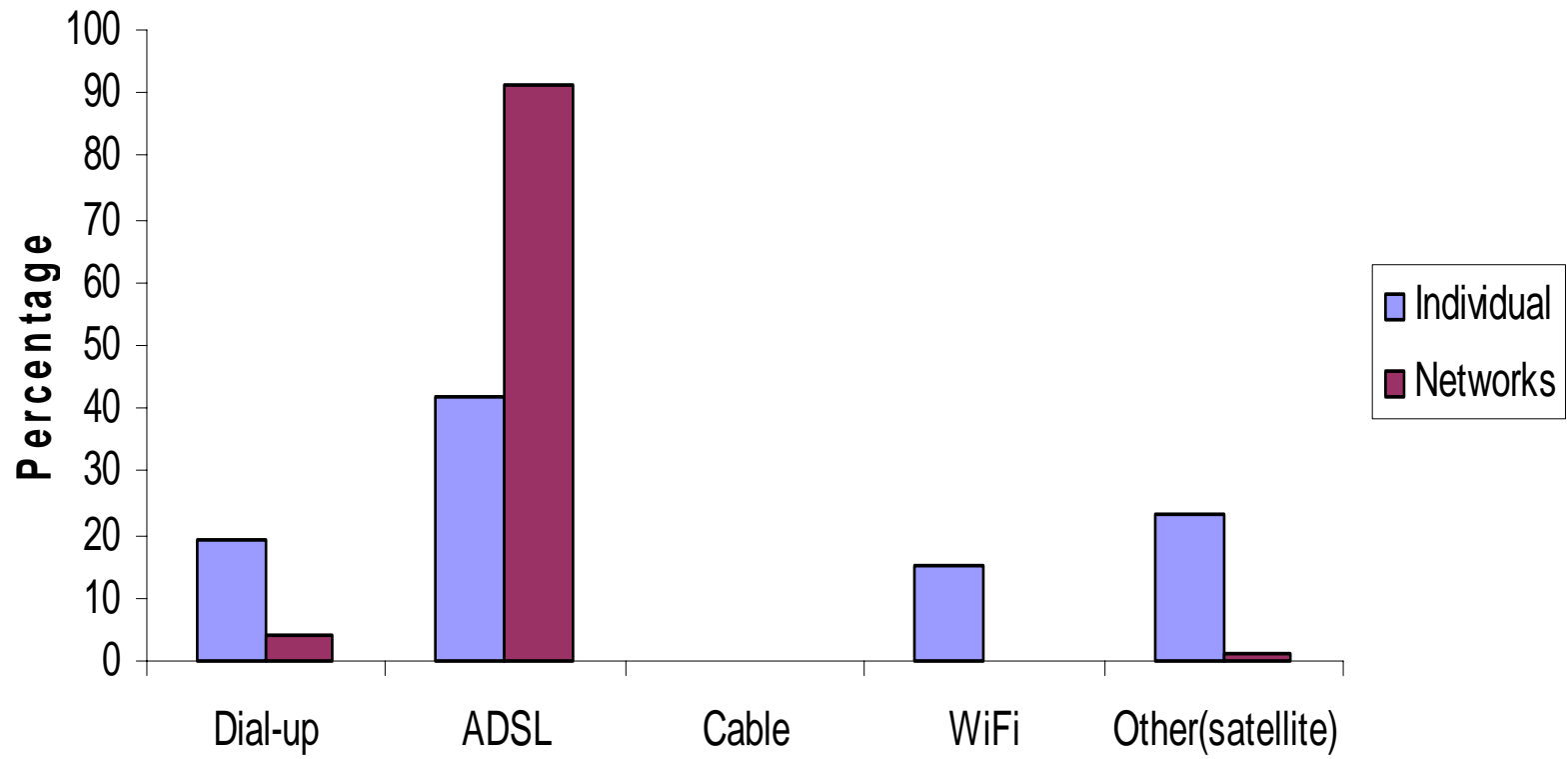
Location of Centres (without Cuba)



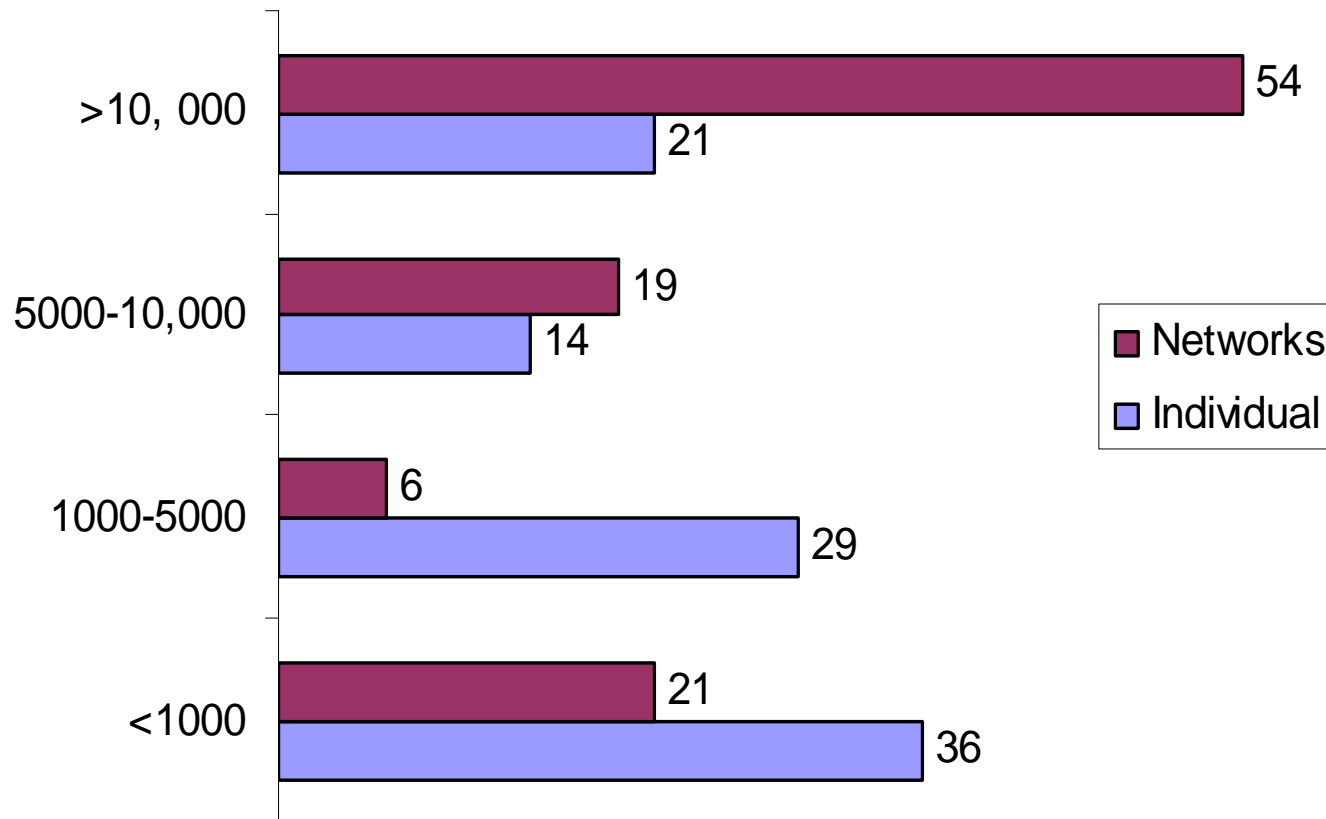
Ownership of telecentres (without Cuba)



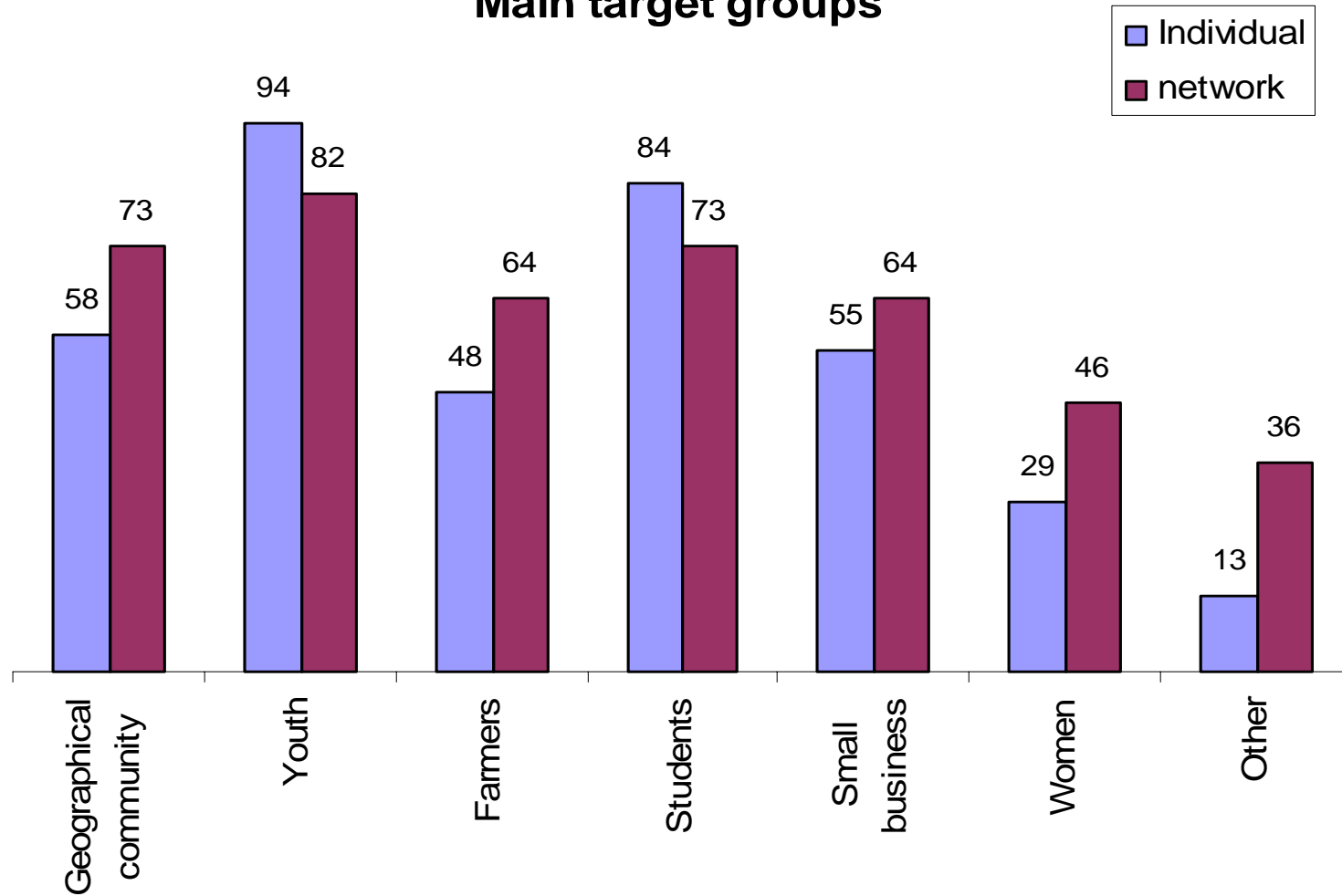
Internet Connection
